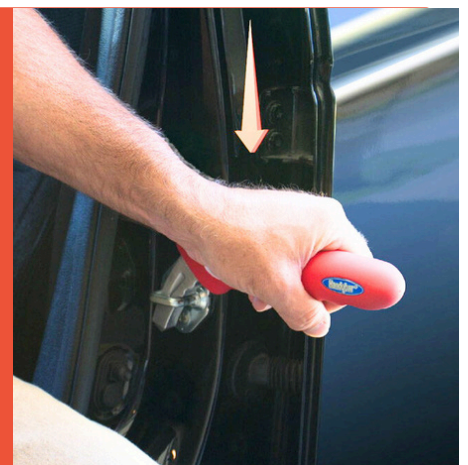
REAL PEOPLE, REAL PROGRESS
